YOUTH EXHIBITORS**

****You must sign up on entry form to be eligible****

1. ***Youth*** exhibitors must sign-up for competition when making entries. Not open to open exhibitors.
2. Pen area must be clearly marked with youths name.
3. Area must be kept clean and neat, including aisle and tack area insuring a proper public presentation.
4. Animals must be cared for. Bedding should be presentable, water buckets kept full and clean, feed pans stored when not in use.
5. ***Each exhibitor must include an inviting educational exhibit. An empty pen may be claimed to decorate and set up the exhibit. Be creative and take this opportunity to inform the public about your livestock..***
6. Judging will take place Tuesday through Friday evening at random. Exhibitors should always be friendly and courteous to barn visitors you never know who may be a judge.
7. Awards will be presented between Showmanship & Classes in each division....

Youth Prospect Market Hogs

1. Classes are open to barrow and gilts.
2. Prospect Market hogs should have been born on or after April 1, 2009.
3. Hair Clipping: For show eligibility, hair length on the pig's body (hams, top, sides and shoulder) must be at least one-half inch. Pigs with body hair less than one-half inch are not eligible for the show.
4. A maximum of 4 hogs may be entered by each exhibitor. Each exhibitor may show two pairs, and/or 4 singles (Hogs may be shown as pairs as well as singles). Designation of singles and pairs will be made within thirty (30) minutes after weigh-in at show.
5. Hogs will be judged on weight divisions regardless of breeding. Classes will be posted after all hogs are weighed. There will be a maximum of 10 hogs per class.
6. Classes for pairs will be determined by total weight.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES

Youth and Open Division

****All animals must be checked in before entering the fairgrounds. No animals are allowed on the grounds prior to the scheduled check-in times. Health papers will be checked at this time.****

1. Reservations are required to be made for stall accommodations (SEE ENTRY FORM). Contact Livestock Superintendent: Courtney Hamblin, P.O. Box 430 Newbern, VA 24126.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for KNOWING and FOLLOWING all rules of the livestock show.
3. Using unethical techniques to train, feed, or medically treat a show animal is prohibited. Anyone found to be using unethical methods with their show animals will be asked to remove animals from the fairgrounds. Water must be available to all livestock.
4. Any animals suspected of carrying a contagious disease will be required to leave the barn.
5. **Good showmanship and conduct is expected from all exhibitors. Anyone who slaps, hits, or mistreats an animal at or during the show will be asked to leave.**
6. All beef and sheep must be on the fairgrounds between 1-5 PM Thursday July 23. All goats must be on the fairgrounds between 12-5 PM. Monday July 20.
7. The Fair Association reserves the right to forfeit all prize money if exhibitors leave before release time, unless permission granted by superintendent.

8. Stalls and pens must be kept clean and neat at all times. No signage will be permitted to be hung from conduit. Shavings will be provided for exhibitors use. Straw may be used but must be removed from stall before leaving.
9. All out of state exhibitors must have veterinarian's health Certificate. Out of state exhibitors are required to have negative T.B. and Bangs Test.
10. All sheep must be registered, all beef must be purebred. Market and commercial classes are exempt.
11. The livestock superintendent reserves the right to refuse entry of any animal.
12. Tie out tie for cattle is 9:00 PM.
13. In youth division all exhibitors must be FFA or 4-H club members, and livestock must be owned by 4-H club or FFA member.
14. The same animal cannot be shown in both open and youth division.
15. Some type of permanent I.D. is required for market lambs.
16. No male goats may be shown.
17. It is highly recommended that exhibitors in showmanship classes wear clean dress shirts/blouses and dark trousers (jeans acceptable). White is recommended for dairy and goat showmanship.
18. Market lambs should be placed in assigned pens and remain in the barn until release time.
19. Lambs may be inspected by Virginia Veterinary Medical Official for signs of contagious disease, including but not limited to foot rot, sore mouth, and club lamb fungus. Any lamb found to possess signs of these diseases will not be allowed to enter fairgrounds and will be prohibited from showing.

21. Classes in showmanship will be judged on showmanship only. ANIMALS MUST BE CLEAN, DRY AND UNFITTED. ALL BEEF CATTLE MUST BE CLEAN, DRY AND UNFITTED FOR THE ENTIRE SHOW.
22. Any complaint must be in writing to livestock superintendent before exhibitors leave the show grounds. Show committee will make final decision regarding complaint. **NO CLASSES WILL BE ADDED OR CHANGED.**
23. **Health papers are required for all animals, brought on fairgrounds, signed by a vet, and dated no later than 30 days before entry day at fair. Health Papers Will Be Checked At Gate.**
24. SHOWMANSHIP AGES:
 - Senior (Age 14-19 as of January 1 of current year)
 - Intermediate (Age 12-13 as of January 1 of current year)
 - Junior (Age 9-11 as of January 1 of current year)
 - Novice (Age 9-13 as of January 1 of current year that has **never shown at NRV Fair.**
 - All entrants will receive a \$5 premium in preliminary rounds.

27. SCRAPIE ERADICATION PROGRAM

- a) The identification rule states that all sheep over 18 months of age (ram, ewes, wethers) have official identification for show/exhibition. This would apply primarily to breeding sheep exhibited at Virginia Fairs.
- b) All breeding stock (ewes and rams), regardless of age, must have official scrapie identification for show/exhibition.
- c) Requirements for scrapie identification (provided the are under 18 months of age). Ewe lambs shown as market lambs will need to have scrapie identification if one of the following circumstances applies.
 1. There are out of state sheep present at the fair, or
 2. A structured sale takes place in conjunction with the market lamb show. If these ewe lambs are sold through a premium or fair sale ("sale" also applies to direct/contract sales which may not include a formal public auction) and do not move DIRECTLY to slaughter they need to have scrapie identification. If any structured sale is held/sponsored in conjunction with the fair/show these ewe lambs shown as market lambs need to have scrapie identifications (the only exception is if they sell and move directly to slaughter which in most cases would be at a local packer plant).
- d) For most fairs/shows that will have only Virginia sheep present, and there is no sale of any kind (all sheep return home), the only sheep that will require scrapie identification are breeding sheep. This will be the case for many local fairs.
- e) All sheep that are purchases this winter and spring for exhibition In the coming year should carry their scrapie identification from the breeder at the time of purchase. This would apply to all breeding stock and also to ewe lambs to be shown as market lambs. (wethers will not need scrapie ID). Therefore, any sheep that will require a scrapie ear tag should already have one at the time they are purchased.
